CALL FOR PAPERS

The *Utafiti* Journal is the official bi-annual publication of the College of Humanities, University of Dar es Salaam. The journal is dedicated to research, practice, advocacy, education and policy within a wide range of topics. *Utafiti* has been in circulation since 1976 and is the oldest published journal of the University of Dar es Salaam. The journal publishes empirical, theoretical, methodological, and practice-oriented articles and book reviews, covering topics relevant to archaeology, applied ethics, creative arts, history, literary studies, foundation studies, philosophy in all its traditions, and all the social sciences. Its scope is interdisciplinary and seeks to both compliment and supplement traditional literatures of all humanities and the social sciences. The journal in its new phase aims to provide a vehicle for researchers focusing on African data who want to reach a wider audience.

We are particularly interested in papers that confront or challenge standard and received assumptions about Africa and international relations. We look forward especially to papers that offer critical studies and paradigm shifts. We encourage articles that:

- contribute to knowledge of the humanities and social sciences through research and examination of methodology;
- develop and advance theories pertinent to Africa and its people;
- attend to issues of policy impacting African individuals and communities;
- utilize quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methodological approaches.

Our blind peer review system garners opinions and supportive critical feedback from relevant specialists on every continent.

Deadline for submissions

For June issue: submitted articles no later than **March 31, 2018**

For December issue: submitted articles no later than **September 30, 2018**

Manuscripts should be submitted electronically, in WORD file format or compatible equivalent, to utafiti@udsm.ac.tz and **directly to the Editor** at helenlauer@yahoo.com

NOTE TO CONTRIBUTORS

1. Manuscripts intended for publication with *Utafiti* should be submitted electronically in 'word' format, double spaced, with wide margins (at least 2.5 cm on all four sides), as measured on standard A4 paper. This rule applies to the entire manuscript, including the reference list, notes and appendix materials –if any.
2. Title page should include the following: (i) title of the article; (ii) name of the author(s) and title(s); (iii) institutional affiliation; and (iv) suggested running head if the title is long.
3. Manuscript can be submitted in English (British or American), Kiswahili, or French; but consistently.
4. Illustrations (artworks, maps, and photographs) should be clear, and of high resolution with legible captions. These should be submitted separately but their locations in the manuscript should be clearly indicated.
5. In case of mathematical expressions (e.g., subscripts and superscripts), they should be correctly placed or clearly marked. Greek letters and unusual symbols should be identified by writing their names in the margin, circling them, at the first occurrence in the paper. Any equation number should go at the right margin. Mathematical symbols for vectors should be labelled as such, e.g., by a wavy underscore.
6. Manuscript should range between 5,000 and 8,000 words (including references and appendices), with an abstract not exceeding 250 words.
7. **Notes, Citations, and References:**
Notes should be numbered consecutively and placed at the end of the article (endnotes). In-text citation should follow 'author-date' system (e.g., Nyerere 1967). Direct quotations should always show the page where it was extracted (e.g., Kjekshus, 1977:125). In case of more than two authors, the name of the first author should be used, followed by "et al. and year (and page number if applies). E.g., (Mkandala et al., 2004:viii). However, names of all authors should appear in the Reference List. Reference list should appear at the end of the document, arranged in alphabetical order, using the second name of the author, or of the first author in case of multiple authors. See the following examples.

8. *Utafiti* is a peer reviewed journal. Articles submitted for publication are reviewed by at least two referees, who are experts in the respective subject. Reviewers are fundamental in determining acceptance or rejection of a manuscript.
9. **Copyright:** It is a condition of publication that authors vest copyright of their articles, including abstracts, in *Utafiti*. This enables the editors to ensure full copyright protection and to disseminate the article, and the journal, to the widest possible readership in print and electronic formats as appropriate. Authors may, of course, use the published article elsewhere under permission from the Chief Editor.
10. Plagiarism is an academic offence. Contributors should submit their own original work, and where other persons' intellectual property has been adopted, be it in form of textual extract, photograph, diagram, formula, etc., it should be dully acknowledged and sometimes proof of owner's consent may apply (especially in case of photographs or artwork).
11. Upon submission of an accepted manuscript (post-review) the author is asked to submit a signed statement declaring that publication of the article by *Utafiti* would not contravene any copyright or other contractual agreements relevant to the article or the research upon which it is based.
12. Complementary copies: Each published submission is entitled for two hard copies of the respective volume or pass-word for accessing the respective volume. That is, complementary copies are by article and not by authors.
